



Enhancements to Policing in Huntington Station

- Special patrols have been assigned to patrol around the Jack Abrams School, both on foot and by vehicle, Monday – Friday during the day shift.
- Patrol squads are providing increased presence and are conducting vehicle checkpoints several times per week on day and evening tours.
- Extra foot posts and extra vehicle patrols are being conducted in the Huntington Station area.
- All Community Orientated Police Enforcement (COPE) section officers spend several hours patrolling each day and evening in the Huntington Station area. In addition, a new special night-time patrol has been instituted, using COPE/Precinct Crime Section officers in marked units Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights until 4 a.m. and from Monday through Thursday nights until 2 a.m. Officers perform high visibility patrol, and endeavor to prevent parties and other gatherings from becoming unruly while at the same time engaging in crime suppression and quality of life enforcement activities.
- Plainclothes officers spend several hours patrolling each day and evening in the Huntington Station area in unmarked vehicles.
- Second Precinct Detectives Squad and Narcotics Detectives are concentrating investigatory efforts, as well as surveillance and patrol in the Huntington Station area.
- Patrol Special Operations Team (Gun/Gang) conducts ongoing patrols, surveillances and enforcement in the Huntington Station area relating to gang activity and street crimes involving guns and gang activity.
- The Special Gang Unit continues to work closely with the FBI in the Huntington Station area. Previous long-term investigation with the FBI resulted in 10 arrests, which removed much of the upper hierarchy of the Latin Kings street gang in Huntington Station.
- Highway Patrol Bureau DWI Team is conducting intensive traffic checkpoints and patrols in the area.
- During the off-season, Marine Bureau officers are assigned to patrol in the immediate vicinity of Jack Abrams School.

- A School Resource Officer is actively involved with school issues in the Huntington Station Community.
- A Community Liaison Officer has been assigned to actively coordinate the creation of neighborhood watch groups, and is attending community and civic meetings.
- Enhanced law enforcement technology is being utilized in the Huntington Station area, including use of the license plate reader vehicle and the mobile speed trailer. Police surveillance cameras are also being utilized to monitor activity around the Jack Abrams School.
- The Second Precinct, in a close cooperative effort with Huntington Town Public Safety officials, has conducted a number of administrative search warrants resulting in numerous housing violations being addressed.
- The Second Precinct, in cooperation with Huntington Town Public Safety, is conducting investigations into State Liquor Authority violations at numerous Huntington Station delis and bodegas.
- The Second Precinct has conducted gun amnesty programs at two local churches in Huntington Station.
